MASS DURING PANDEMIC

The procedures below incorporate the liturgical practices mandated by Bishop John Stowe, OFM Conv.

The general dispensation from the obligation to attend Mass on Sundays and Holy Days ended on Nov. 28, 2021

(decree issued by Bishop John Stowe, OFM Conv. in the Diocese of Lexington on November 15, 2021). Those who are **vulnerable or immune-compromised** because of age or health reasons are under **no obligation** to attend Mass at the risk of their well-being.

Our parish offers live streaming of Mass via our YouTube Channel and Facebook Page at 9:30am on most Sundays. Listening by radio (*104.3 FM*) from your vehicle in the church parking lot is an option; upon arrival, please notify a greeter that you would like to receive Communion outside.

BEFORE ARRIVING

- If you have a fever or flu like symptoms, please stay at home.
- **Whether vaccinated or not, wearing a face mask is required for all people.**

ARRIVAL PROCEDURE

- **Face masks should be worn as soon as you exit your vehicle.**
- Pews have been designated for those who wish to continue social distancing.

MASS PROCEDURE

- Please keep your mask on throughout Mass.
- **The congregation is NOT to sing**, only cantors. Please only listen. Hymnals are now available for parishioners to follow the scriptural readings.
- Offertory baskets will not be passed. Instead as you leave Mass, you can drop donations in receptacles placed in the narthex.
- There is to be no physical contact during the Lord's Prayer or during the Sign of Peace.

COMMUNION PROCEDURE

- Communion will be distributed only in the form of Bread and will be given in the hand from the altar steps. Distribution is again available on the tongue and will be given from the narthex.
- Gloves are NOT to be worn when receiving Communion. Hand sanitizer is encouraged.

DEPARTURE PROCEDURE

- Bulletins are now available at Mass. They will continue to be emailed and offered on our website.
- Sanitation of the church is no longer required.

After being appointed by Governor Bevin as a member of the Kentucky Telehealth Board in 2017, she was then elected Chair of the Board. She now serves on the Steering Committee for the State of Kentucky Division of Telehealth.
