


**CCD** Classes have resumed at 11am in Gabriel Hall classrooms. **2027 Confirmation class** has begun and will join the High School group to start.

Taking his cue from Augustine, Frank Matera provides an exposition of the sermon for contemporary readers who wish to use the sermon as the standard by which they live their lives every day. ## Why does the season of Lent last 40 days?

*The number 40 has deep biblical roots and has a rich symbolism that refers to specific biblical events that took place thousands of years ago.*

Each year the Roman Rite of the Catholic Church celebrates the liturgical season of Lent with 40 days of prayer and fasting in preparation for the great celebration of Easter. This number is very symbolic and has deep ties to multiple biblical events.

### Number 40 in the Bible

#### The Flood

The first mention of 40 occurs in the book of Genesis. God proclaims to Noah, "For in seven days I will send rain upon the earth forty days and forty nights; and every living thing that I have made I will blot out from the face of the ground" (Genesis 7:4). This event connects the number 40 to purification and renewal, a time when the earth was washed clean and made anew.

#### Recognizing our sinfulness

In Numbers we see the number 40 again, this time as a type of penance and punishment imposed on the people of Israel for disobeying God. They had to wander in the desert for 40 years so that a new generation could inherit the Promised Land, instead of the people who did not trust in God's plan for them.

#### Repentance and conversion of heart

In the book of Jonah, the prophet proclaims to Nineveh, "Yet forty days, and Nineveh shall be overthrown! And the people of Nineveh believed God; they proclaimed a fast, and put on sackcloth, from the greatest of them to the least of them" (Jonah 3:4).

#### A time of prayer and preparation

The prophet Elijah, before he encountered God on Mount Horeb, traveled for forty days, "And he arose, and ate and drank, and went in the strength of that food forty days and forty nights to Horeb the mount of God (1 Kings 19:8). This connects 40 to a time of spiritual preparation, a time when the soul is led to a place where it can hear the voice of God.

#### Engaging in a spiritual battle

Before embarking on his own public ministry, Jesus "was led up by the Spirit into the wilderness to be tempted by the devil. And he fasted forty days and forty nights" (Matthew 4:1-2). In continuity with the past, Jesus sets out to pray and fast for 40 days, combating temptation and preparing himself for proclaiming the Gospel to others.

In the end, all of these episodes in the Gospel reveal different reasons why the number 40 was selected for the season of Lent. It was not an arbitrary choice, but one that was firmly rooted in the Bible. Together they provide for us a spiritual guide for Lent, inviting us to open our hearts to God. **General Offertory Funds** are used to support the day-to-day operational expenses such as office supplies, printing, church supplies, payroll, and utilities. **Building Fund collections** goes towards facility upkeep and maintenance. **Poor Fund collections** go to help some of our parishioners with

financial difficulties as well as the LIGHT Center, LUMC Diaper Bank, and Anderson United. The diocese will have **second collections** for specific needs of the Catholic Church and its mission work. This week's Scholarship donations will go toward the Fr McDonald Scholarship fund which is awarded in June.

**National Black and Native American Missions** will be taken up in our diocese on February 21-22. This collection helps support a wide variety of evangelization and educational efforts throughout the United States, including our own diocese. The Diocese of Lexington receives an annual grant from this collection to support multi-cultural efforts, to provide funding for speakers, conferences and training, and to purchase special resource materials for use throughout the diocese.

## Fasting and Almsgiving

---

As we enter into Lent we fast as a way to spiritually prepare for Easter by imitating Jesus' 40 days of fasting in the desert, practicing self-denial, and making more room in their lives for God through a physical act of sacrifice, essentially deepening their connection to Christ's suffering and ultimately celebrating his resurrection with greater appreciation; this practice is considered a form of penance and is meant to be accompanied by increased prayer and acts of charity.

We will again be collecting money for the Food Pantry. Please consider donating the money you would have spent on your meal in the box in the narthex as a donation to others in need. Or, bring a food donation to the food box in the narthex.

### About the Rice Bowls:

CRS Rice Bowl is the Lenten program of Catholic Relief Services, the official relief and development agency of the United States Conference of Catholic Bishops.

Rooted in the history of the Eucharistic Congress, CRS Rice Bowl invites Catholics and faith communities in the United States to encounter God and our global family throughout Lent by practicing the pillars of prayer, fasting and almsgiving. Lenten alms donated through CRS Rice Bowl support the work of CRS in more than 120 different countries each year. Twenty-five percent of donations to CRS Rice Bowl stay in the local diocese, supporting hunger and poverty alleviation efforts. Since its inception in 1975, CRS Rice Bowl has raised more than \$350 million.

**Fasting**  
Catholics who are 18-58 years old are required to keep a limited fast: a single, normal meal & 2 snacks.

**Abstinence**  
Catholics 14 years & older are required to abstain from eating meat and fowl.
