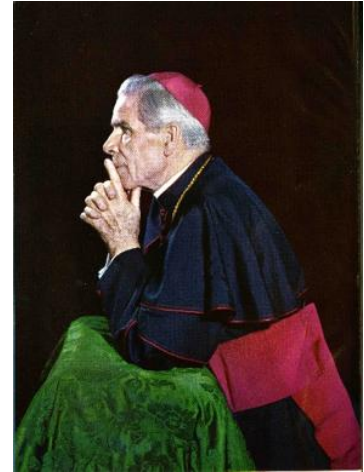

American Archbishop Fulton J. Sheen was officially beatified on Thursday, September 24, 2026, at The Dome at America's Center in St. Louis, Missouri.

“You are infinitely precious because you are loved by God.”

Who was Fulton Sheen?

Born in 1895 in El Paso, IL Fulton Sheen was ordained a Catholic priest on September 20, 1919. His talents as a preacher were first seen during his time teaching at The Catholic University of America. In 1926 he began broadcasting Lenten talks on radio stations in New York. He soon began a weekly talk on The Catholic Hour radio program, where he spoke on a range of topics including Mary, the Eucharist, communism, and more. He discussed the relevance of the Gospel in day-to-day Catholic life. He became a Bishop on June 11, 1951. He also began his television series Life is Worth Living that year - the most widely-viewed religious show in the history of television. It was for this show that he won an Emmy Award for Most Outstanding Television Personality in 1953. He was nominated for the same award again in 1954 and for the Best Male Personality-Continuing Performance in 1957. He appeared on the cover of Time Magazine on April 14, 1952. His influence led to countless conversions to Catholicism. In 1966 he became the Bishop of Rochester, a position he resigned in 1969. He spent the remainder of his life preaching and writing. He died on December 9, 1979.



In the Catholic Church, beatification is the step before being declared a saint, granting a deceased person the title "Blessed" and allowing limited public veneration after proving heroic virtue and one verified miracle. A verified miracle attributed to Archbishop Sheen's intercession—the unexplained healing of an infant—helped bring him to this joyful step toward sainthood. Canonization is the final step, declaring the person a saint, permitting reverence across the entire Church, and requiring a second miracle after beatification, making their veneration universal. Essentially, beatification opens the door for local honor, while canonization opens it for the whole world, recognizing a saint as being in heaven with God.

The Minor Prophets

Haggai

This book appears odd at first glance, its mostly concerned with construction of a temple, which is odd given that the people of God have been exiled from the promised land and couldn't build a temple even if they wanted to. But the message of the prophet is clear, the time of being disciplined has come to an end, and the time to rebuild is here. However, the real restoration isn't about making a new temple of wood and stone, rather the true rebuilding of the people will be as their hearts turn back to God.

Malachi

A fitting book to end this series of prophets, God assures the people that he still loves them and intends to restore the covenant. He reminds the people where they went wrong in the first place but also encourages the people that he is a God that judges according to the heart. If we repent and return to him, we will always find a loving and forgiving God.

Many of you are aware that the elevator is not working. We are sorry for the inconvenience this has caused. The sump pump has been repaired, and we are working with the elevator company to repair the damage caused by the water. We are working closely with the repair company and the insurance company to get this done in a timely manner.

We are investigating the installation of gutter guards on the church and rectory to prevent damage around the roof perimeter and help with erosion. Installation of the Stations of the Cross is under way. All materials used were either donated or paid for through private donations.

Lawrenceburg Police Department every year takes children from Anderson County shopping for Christmas. Many of

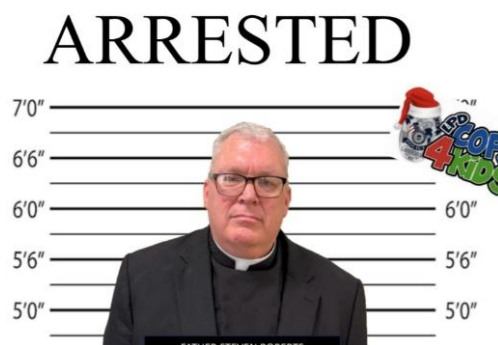
these children would have no Christmas without this wonderful program.

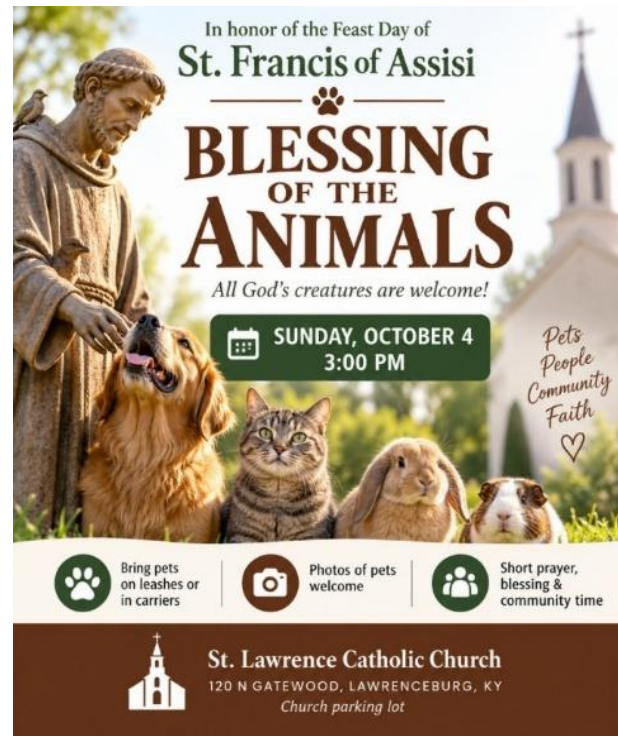

Respect Life Month | October

Each October the Church in the United States celebrates Respect Life Month, and the first Sunday of October is observed as Respect Life Sunday. As Catholics, we are called to cherish, defend, and protect those who are most vulnerable, from the beginning of life to its end, and at every point in between. During the month of October, the Church asks us to reflect more deeply on the dignity of every human life.

Part retreat, part celebration of what it means to be Catholic, this event will help you get another year of youth ministry (and confirmation prep) started off right. I wanted to share a few upcoming Come & See opportunities for men discerning the priesthood. All of these opportunities are free to attend. Interested men who are 18 or older can contact me directly at mbentley@cdlex.org; for those under 18, please feel free to share the information with their families.

Our next Saint Meinrad Come & See is October 8–11, 2026. This is most appropriate for college-age men and older — those who would enter major seminary if they eventually applied and were accepted.

Bishop Simon Bruté College Seminary also has Come & See weekends November 5–8, February 4–7, and March 11–14. These are geared especially toward high school seniors and recent graduates.
