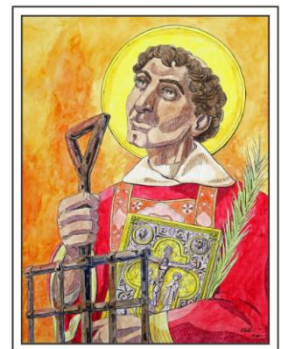

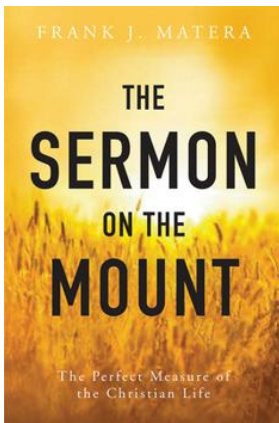
St Lawrence Formation

Adult Sunday School meets this week. **The most important 2000 words ever spoken or written, Jesus' Sermon on the Mount.** Our book discussion will be from *The Sermon on the Mount* by Frank Matera. Saint Augustine once described the Sermon on the Mount as "the perfect measure of the Christian life." Taking his cue from Augustine, Frank Matera provides an exposition of the sermon for contemporary readers who wish to use the sermon as the standard by which they live their lives every day. Join us on Sunday at 11 am as we explore this amazing book. More books are available.

The month of May is dedicated to Mary. This Sunday during Mass, we have a ceremony with a procession, prayers, hymns and our statue of Mary is crowned with flowers. Called the May Crowning, it is a symbol of Mary's role as Queen of Heaven and her position as a perfect follower of Christ. The flowers also represent the beauty of Spring and the new life offered through Christ.

The Acts of the Apostles

The Acts of the Apostles serves as a sort of sequel to the gospel of Luke. Written by the same author, the Gospel according to Luke tells the story of what God has done through Jesus, whereas Acts tells the story of what God has done (and in some ways is still doing!) through his Church. In both cases, God is clearly portrayed as the protagonist in the story and the apostles are merely invited to tag along.

While the book is called the Acts of the Apostles, the book really focuses on two apostles in particular: St. Peter and St. Paul. But more important than these two men are the missionary work

that God enacts through them. The first third of the book tells the story of the Church’s early missionary work among the Jewish people, the nation to which all of the original apostles belonged. Then it moves on to tell the story of Peter and Paul’s missionary journeys into the gentile world, as the gospel begins to spread “to the ends of the earth”. However, this rapid spread of the Church among both the Jewish and non-Jewish worlds also becomes a source of conflict. And while we see martyrdom featured throughout the whole of the book, the last third of the book is particularly focused on these early conflicts, with whole chapters dedicated almost entirely to St. Paul’s speeches defending himself before government officials.

This isn’t quite a history book. We know from St. Paul’s letters that some of the biggest conflicts of the early church are barely glossed over, and some of the greatest missionary journeys of the early apostles, as preserved by our tradition, aren’t mentioned at all. But instead, we should read this as an introduction to the Church and why she exists. It is the book that the lectionary would have us meditate upon in this Easter season, because it is the book that looks at the fact of the resurrection and asks, “now what?”

The original design was done by Joey Carbajal and Mary Whitely. Last summer Carbajal Garden Center prepared the site, planted the majority of the shrubs, and installed drip irrigation. They recently installed the trees. Deacon Chris Cecil donated the beautiful stain glass of our Lady

of Guadalupe. Mary Whitely and her volunteers planted the flowers and plantings to complete the design. We are awaiting the completion of the walkway and replacement of 2 trees that did not survive transplantation last summer. In a continuing effort to beautify our grounds, we are updating the gardens to the left and right of the stairs into the church from the parking lot. We have had a tree specialist look at the trees that are in those gardens, and we have decided to take them out. We will replace them with smaller shrubs and plants that are easier to maintain. We have been blessed with donations to cover all the cost of the Prayer Garden and this additional garden renovation. General Offertory Funds are used to support the day-to-day operational expenses such as office supplies, printing, church supplies, payroll, and utilities. **Building Fund collections** goes towards facility upkeep and maintenance. **Poor Fund collections** go to help some of our parishioners with financial difficulties as well as the LIGHT Center, LUMC Diaper Bank, and Anderson United. The diocese will have **second collections** for specific needs of the Catholic Church and its mission work.

You may have noticed that we have had a lot of work done lately. We had 2 air-conditioning units replaced this month, one in the church and the other in the Family Life Center. We have been maintaining them for quite a while; however, they were both too old (28 yrs for one unit, the other was 31 yrs old) and too costly to fix and so they were replaced. The A/C unit in the CCD classrooms was also in need of repair. That unit was under warranty and therefore wasn't costly to repair.

We had an attempted break in at the Family Life Center. The door lock was damaged, but the intruders did not gain access due to the electronic locking system we had installed a few years ago. The push bar/key system is no longer made and will need to be converted to another opening system. We have sent the information into insurance, and they have approved our claim. Work on the new locking mechanism will begin as soon as logistics are worked out.
